
President's Message

I am often asked what do you get out of flying? That can be a complicated answer based on your personal experience. I often reply about how flying instills confidence in yourself. Being able to physically and mentally command a plane takes skill. Because the skills are critical to one's safety it builds confidence like few other activities can. I was reminded of this recently as my son is about 10 hours into flight training. I can see and hear his confidence growing with each lesson. Think back to your flight training. Did you feel confidence build as you went? Did that carry over into other aspects of your life? If you are asked about what flying means to you don't just talk about the fun you have but what it means to you as a person. An explanation like that will provide a much deeper insight in what flying is.

Tech Counselor Tip

A flying tip this month. I was thinking about taking pictures of a friend's house on the Maine coast. The sectional shows the environmental sensitivity marking over his

house. There are many of these areas in New England and around the country. The restrictions on this type of airspace are not described on sectional charts. I looked up the restrictions on the internet. The FAA regulations state pilots are requested to maintain 2000 ft AGL over this area. It specifically says requested, not required. Hence you can legally fly below 2000 ft. Practically speaking you should stay over 2000 ft unless you have a specific reason to be in the airspace. If you do venture in it would be best to reduce engine power and propeller RPM. No sense making a racquet if you can avoid it.



FAA News

The FAA will transition to mandatory use of the international flight plan format for all IFR and VFR domestic and international civil flights on August 27, 2019. The change is part of an effort to modernize and streamline flight planning and supports the FAA's NextGen initiatives. Several improvements to the international form make it easier and more intuitive for pilots to use and will increase safety, including an increase in the size of the departure and destination fields to allow a greater variety of entry types, including Special Flight Rules Area (SFRA) flight plans.

The international format will also allow for integration of Performance Based Navigation (PBN) and enhance air traffic control services by allowing for easier identification of equipage, which can make greater use of airspace. When using flight plan filing services, all features available today will be part of the new format and provide an additional level of detail required for deployment of the FAA's NextGen technologies and procedures.
