### **Meeting Minutes**

November 17, 2024

President Mark Scott called the meeting to order at 10:00. Other officers present, Treasurer Bill Jagoda, Vice President James Calver. There were 38 attendees.

Visitors: Matt, a student pilot from Oxford with 115hrs in an Archer, Glenn and his son who'd been to a recent Young Eagle Rally, and Ray brought his 2 sons, one of whom had 2 Young Eagle flights.

Treasurer's report: working balance \$2,946.52. Bill reported \$82 in donations from the recent Young Eagle rally. He also provided an update on the Ray Scholarship funding for Anthony indicating that we are in good shape.

Projects: Dave Matuska reported on his first flight in his KitFox - Congratulations Dave! He indicated that it was a perfect day. The engine performed well, and he circled the airport at 6,000'. Since his first flight, 3.5 hours total, he's had two more successful flights, making good use of flight following, and commented that Bradley was accommodating as he transitioned around their airspace. He also reported that the new EAA flight cards are good and have relaxed the 40-hour initial Phase 1 flying requirement.

Dave Rich and Al Starbord have acquired a 60% completed SuperCubX. Dave reported that they expect to complete the build in the next 18 months. The acquisition came complete with engine and avionics.

Jim is nearing completion of his RV14 horizontal stabilizer. He commented on the good use of a cube shaped titanium bucking bar to get into tight spaces.

Mike alerted the group to a recent AD for Lycoming engines--failure in flight of connecting rod bushings in engines built between 2009-2017. A regular oil analysis, logging the results and noting the bronze content is recommended.

Young Eagles: 44 kids attended the October YE Rally - lower than the registered number as a result of a change in the day due to weather.

Ray Scholar: Anthony and Tom Spitler gave an update. Anthony has been working on slow flight and emergency procedures. Tom updated the group on the 2025 Ray Scholarship process noting that our application is due in January and candidate recommendations in March. He also noted that the scholarship has increased to \$12k, and that we are the only chapter in CT that received a scholarship this year.

Old and New Business, Announcements: Mark has been approached by the City of Meriden Boy Scout troop leader for a merit badge program.

Mark announced a fly out to VT Chapter 613 on Nov 24—3 miles from the Canadian border! It's an active chapter with 14 kids, their own hanger, 2 story facility, and an a/c build program with 20 girls.

### Ray Scholarship for 2025:

The selection Process has begun for 2025. They have increased the amount of the scholarship in 2025 to \$12,000.

First, our chapter must file an application by January 31st 2025. Once our application goes through the approval process during the month of February we will then be told whether we have been granted a scholarship for the 2025 period. Next we will create an application for our potential scholars to complete and submit to the selection committee for review and selection of our candidate.

### Tech Tip of the Month

Our spark plugs tend to get fouled with carbon and lead deposits over time. This is especially true if engines are run rich most of the time in the pattern. The flight school has this problem in spades. They use this slick device to clean their plugs. You put them in the bag and connect an air hose. Blasting media inside swirls all over with force and cleans them out. You can find this unit for about \$30 on line. Aircraft spruce has something similar for about \$40.



### Places to Fly

If you are looking to test your short takeoff and landing skills visit Toutant airport (C44) in North East Connecticut. I visited there in early December. The runway is 1756 x 60 ft with clear approaches at both ends. Runway 17 final approach path is obscured by a hill and trees on base leg. You can't see the runway until you have turned final. The pavement is in good condition. There is a parking area midfield. There are no runway lights so don't go there at night. It is a private airport open to the public with a nice house looking over the airport and a large private hangar. When I was there a lady said hello over the radio. (Mark)
