# TETRAHEDRON REPAINTED—AGAIN

Under the leadership of Fran Uliano, the tetrahedron and windsock light pole at Meriden Airport has been repainted to a lustrous Day-Glo orange color once again. Previous painting of the tetrahedron has resulted in a rapid fading of the finish. We have now applied a primer, a new brand of Day-Glo paint and a clear coat. This application is expected to last longer than the previous coatings. Only time will tell how long the new coatings will last.

The volunteers for the primer painting were Fran Uliano, Chris Kohler and Jim Simmons. A day later, the Day-Glo paint was applied by Fran Uliano, Rick Bernardi and Bob Brown. And

### **Directions:**

Flying: tell ATC that you are taxiing to the T-hangars. You will eventually taxi either on Alpha or Juliet to Charlie. At Charlie, go west to the T-hangars and park on the ramp to the north of the older, blue

From the south: I-91 N, take exit 27 (bear right, then quickly get into middle lane at light) Chowder Pot will be on your right. Skip to "All directions" below.

From the south: 5-15 N, Take exit 87 to your right, then get into the middle lane. Chowder Pot will be on your right. Skip to "All directions" below.

From the north or west: I-91 S, take exit 27 to airport road. Take a left onto airport road. Stay in left lane until "T" intersection of Brainard road (approx. .3 miles). Follow "All directions" below.

All directions: Left onto Brainard Road, keep right (note: Brainard road becomes Maxim road). After railroad tracks and through intersection of Murphy Road, right on Lindbergh Drive. 230 Lindbergh Drive is approximately one half mile on left.

Please park outside the fence and someone will let you in. You will see Mike Zemsta's RV-10 near the hangar.

## MEETING MINUTES

#### May 18, 2008

**Call to order:** The meeting for EAA Chapter 27 was called to order by President, Jim Simmons. All officers were present.

**Recognition of Visitors:** Welcome to Tom Pittendreigh and Dave Adams. Dave is working on a Sinus motor glider.

**Treasurer**—Bill Jagoda: Bill reported a balance of \$954.10. Thank you, Bill!

**Technical Counselor**—Dave Pepe: Mike Zemsta's RV-10 is progressing in its final stages. As Mike put it, "It'll be ready to fly in about 2-3 weeks but the paperwork will take about 2-3 months!"

**Young Eagles**—Fran Uliano: Fran announced that Laura Hargreaves, has received an additional \$414.00 from Chapter 334 in Groton as the result of their donating 10 points from their Young Eagle flights.

Fran also asked for volunteers for International Young Eagle Day, which will be held on Saturday, June 14th at MMK. Mike Zemsta suggested that the parents be given Young Eagle brochures and information so they could help promote Young Eagles to other parents.

**Director/Newsletter Editor/Website Editor Report:** Rick Beebe asked all members to remember that we are always seeking pictures of project aircraft and you can upload them yourself to our web site.

Rick also summarized the highlights of the April 25-26 Directors meeting at Oshkosh which include the major renovations and additions to the site at Oshkosh. Rick supplied some sample layouts of the changes which include new vendor display buildings, walkways, etc. in order to improve the overall experience at Oshkosh.

**Airport Improvement Projects:** Tetrahedron painting (again!). Jim asked for volunteers as the paint was due to arrive in the next week.

Saturday, June 7th, will be MMK's annual

- Jim Maher announced that the Red Bull Air Races will be held in Detroit and Canada on May 31 – June 1. This is the closest to Connecticut the races have been held.
- Our June meeting will be held at Brainard Airport (HFD) at Steve's hangar where Mike Zemsta's RV-10 is nearing completion.

We are still anxiously awaiting the profiles to be written from past 50/50 raffle winners which include: Max Lopez, Charlie Enz, Ron Slossar, Bob Brown, George Anderson, Bob Rousse, Steve Fraas and Ralph Colavolpe. Everyone has a story!

Seminar Presentation: Harold Rochette, a B-17 pilot who flew his first of 31 missions on Friday, May 13, 1944 as part of the 344th squadron of the 384 bomb group, recounted a few of his many experiences while flying bombing missions in Europe. He explained how, at times, he flew 10 missions in 12 days and that rest was not an option. He also said that the average age of air crews, at that time was 19 years old with some, who lied about their age, being as young as 15-17 years old!

Mr. Rochette explained the title of his book, "8th Air Force Lottery," in that you were UNLUCKY if your name was called because at that time in the war, crew members who flew on bombers over Germany had a 71% chance of being killed.

Mr. Rochette also explained that he was able to write his book with such detail because of his diary he kept throughout his combat experience. His presentation held everyone's interest intently and he graciously had signed copies of his book available afterwards.
