

President's Message

Once again, our Young Eagles rally was a great success. Thanks to Brian and everyone else who make this happen. We have really got this down. This may have been the smoothest running one I have seen. Hopefully you were able to use some tips from the flying kids and adults presentation a few months or so back. I know I did. I had the full range from older and enthusiastic to young and nervous. I think the ADS-B in helps a lot when the area gets busy during the rally. I was able to see planes coming and going with altitude difference call outs. If you have not upgraded to ADS-B I highly recommend it given New England's air traffic density and lots of Class B and C airspace.

Tech Counselor Tip

Don't wipe that dirt or oil off as soon as you see it! Many times while looking around the engine compartment you see wet oil spots or dirty deposits on surfaces. Of course, they are not supposed to be there and you need to figure out why they are there. For tracking down oil leaks find the highest spot on the engine where you see wetness. This will be the level or slightly below the level where the leak is. Try to trace the wet pattern to the wettest area. Your leak will be near there. Regarding dirt like deposits, first see if you can figure out what it is. Dirt is pretty easy to identify. A very dark gray powdery substance could be aluminum powder. Sometimes you can get fiberglass shavings mixed with a little oil sticking to the fire wall. Once identified you can start to zero in on where it may be coming from. Recently I had two half dollar sized dark powdery spots on the inside of my engine cowl door. They were outside of the cooling baffles so it was not coming from the engine. I visualized where the door would be in flight, then noticed they were right next to the aluminum cooling baffles joints. Over 500 hrs of flight the baffles have been fretting and producing powder. I could not see fretting at the joint unless I looked very carefully. Now I know what it is and feel better about it.
