

In August, I focused on my landing technique, particularly the crucial skill of flaring. I also continued to work on flying maneuvers, dedicated time to pattern work, and learned radio communication skills in a towered environment. Using foggles, I began recording VOR time, enhancing my instrument flying abilities. Additionally, I gained experience with towered landings at Brainard Airport and initiated training in short field and soft field takeoffs. My flight training included a tour of Bradley International Airport tower, where I gained valuable insights into air traffic control operations.

I went to UCONN Engineering Camp, it was awesome. I got a taste of different engineering fields, heard from real engineers about their work, and teamed up with fellow campers to create an underwater Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV). It was a fantastic experience that fueled my passion for STEM and broadened my horizons about all the cool things you can do in these fields.

Following UCONN I headed off to Space Camp. My time at Space Camp in Huntsville, Alabama was packed with incredible experiences. I got to see the colossal Saturn 5 Rocket, dive deep into discussions about the thrilling Artemis program, and even geeked out over space law - all of which really left an impact. But it wasn't all about lectures; I had some real adventures, like scuba diving and building and launching rockets, which was a blast, to say the least. Meeting an actual astronaut and having heart-to-heart conversations with NASA engineers was definitely a highlight, giving me a deeper appreciation for space science and technology.

Tech Tip of the Month

I found a nice airspeed indicator at a recent fly in for only \$40. It has larger numbers and a true airspeed setting knob. Just what I was looking for!. However, the airspeed ranges were not correct for my airplane. Wag Aero sells a packet of red, yellow, green, and white airspeed band adhesive backed decals for standard 3 1/8 instruments. ("Instrument Range Marking Kit", Part No A-005-199). I was able to cover up and extend ranges as required. I think it looks pretty good. United instruments and others sell airspeed indicators without speed ranges. You can customize them as needed with this kit from Wag Aero. (Mark)

The South ramp paving has begun. Be mindful of the various traffic cones and barriers at entrances and around the ramp as work continues.




Tail Wheel Fly In and Picnic
